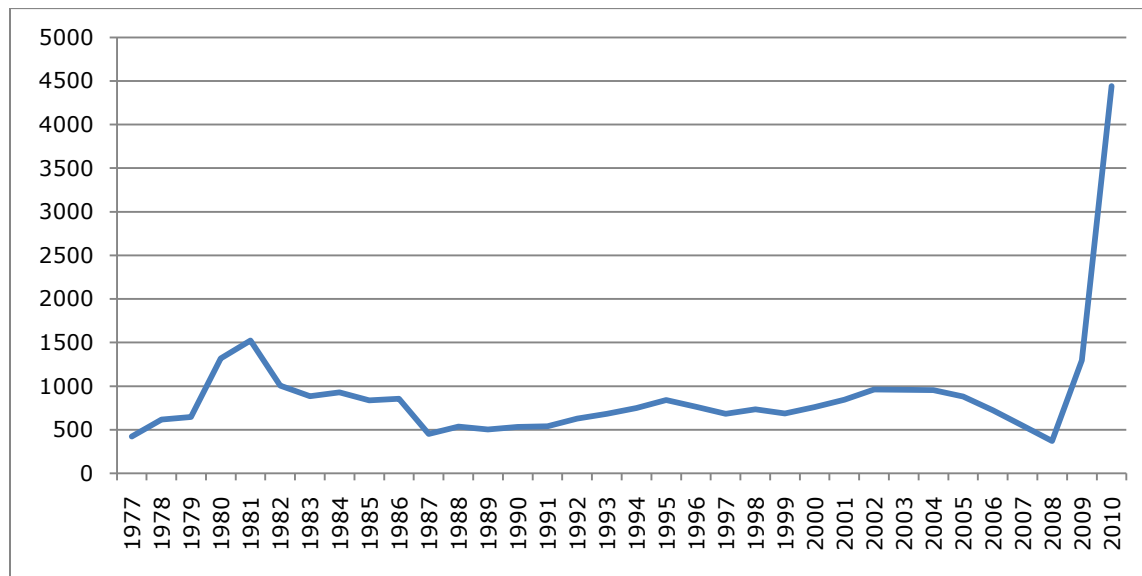


US BUDGET SERIES Long-term Trends in Funding for Energy Conservation^a
